
Diocese of Baton Rouge Prayer for Vocations

Synodal Listening Session at The Catholic Life Center

In late 2021 and early 2022, the Diocese of Baton Rouge responded to Pope Francis' call for the entire Church to engage in a synodal process. Your participation in these sessions led to a report that was presented to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). This report can be found here: https://diobr.org/synod. While the synodal process is scheduled to conclude in October 2024, the Holy Father, has once again asked for our participation.

On Monday, March 18, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. in the Ballroom of the Catholic Life Center, a listening session will be held and facilitated. All the faithful are invited to participate.
