Scripture Readings for Third Sunday of Lent

Exodus 20: 1-7

We have received the Ten Commandments as a gift from God. God has given us rules in order to protect us and out of His love. His instruction is a summation of our duties to Him and to others.

I Corinthians 1: 22-25

The crucified Christ was a "stumbling block" to the Jews. A stumbling block was first used as the part of the trap to which they attached the bait. Then later, it came to mean the trap itself – an occasion of offense. The finished work was a hindrance to current Jewish doctrine. They expected a triumphant Messiah who would establish a kingdom but Christ was a crucified Messiah.

John 2: 13-25

In Matthew we also read about the "cleansing of the temple." Jesus overturned the tables of the money changers and the benches of those selling doves. The blind and the lame came to him at the temple, and he healed them. Compassionate love trumps those who would exploit the vulnerable.



All of our Masses are offered for specific intentions. Mass Intentions may be requested in advance and reserved if available. The suggested (non-tax deductible) donation is \$5.




